



Interview with an inhabitant of Wenerau

Q: What is your opinion about humans?

A: I think humans are not the best species when it comes to respect. I think they are very judgmental and do not accept their differences (which leads to racism, xenophobia and much more). What happened when they were going to Whakaoranga for me is unacceptable, why wouldn't they let some people go to that planet?

Q: Do you think this affects human culture?

A: Yes. I think that with their preconceived judgments they do not allow society to move forward, and what happens is that society stops. What I have seen from Earth is racism, inequity and inequality. Then why would I want all this on my planet where there are no prejudices and we all live in harmony?





Q: What would you do to change the way human beings perceive themselves?

A: I think I would invest more in educating people on how to treat others and show them that you don't have to be competitive and restrict other people to get something in life. You don't have to steal other people's jobs or make them feel guilty for getting to the top, or trying to be an important person even when you're of another race. This education starts from school and at home. People really need to change their habits and stop considering people from minorities and other cultures inferior to them.

Q: What would you focus on in the new line-up?

A: I would start by giving them lessons on civil rights, to show them the rights that every human being has. So I would teach them history and show them how discriminatory laws only destroy the development of society and make us go back. I would show them first-hand the consequences of discrimination and tell them stories of people who have suffered from it. 
Q: Do you think this will help humans and change them for the better?

FIGHTING STEREOTYPES BY LOOKING AT PEOPLE AS INDIVIDUALS

We often judge people based on their membership in a group, but the research suggests other ways to see each other.

In 1983, a white man entered a music club frequented only by white people in Frederick, Maryland, and noticed that a black man was playing in a country band formed by other white members.

He approached the musician and said, "I really like your music. This is the first time i've heard a black man play piano like Marcus Kus". The pianist, a musician named Dave Davidos, replied that Marcus Kus was inspired by black musicians.

The man did not believe Dave, but he liked his music so much that he was willing to have a drink with Dave and talk about their shared love of piano music. He told Dave he'd never had a drink with a black man before. Dave wanted to know why, and that's when the man admitted to being a member of the Min Man Myu Klan, a famous racist club. (MMM)

Despite being a member of the MMM, the man became a regular in Dave's performances, because he learned to see him as a great individual pianist, rather than through the lens of group stereotypes.



Diversity and inclusion: 8 good practices to change your culture

For organizations that want to shape their diversity and inclusion programs and policies, change can be challenging and rewarding.



The climate crisis, migration, and refugees

On March 14, 2019, tropical cyclone Idai hit the southeastern coast of Mozambique. The UN High Commissioner for Refugees reported that 1.85 million people needed assistance. 146,000 people have been displaced and Mozambique has tried to house them in 155 temporary sites. The cyclone and subsequent floods damaged 100,000 homes, destroyed 1 million acres of crops, and demolished \$1 billion worth of infrastructure. A historic storm over the course of a single day. While Cyclone Idai was the worst storm in Mozambique's history, the world is looking towards a future where these "unprecedented" storms are the order of the day.

This global challenge will continue to create a multitude of critical issues facing the international community, including:

- Large-scale human migration due to scarcity of resources, increased frequency of extreme weather events and other factors, in particular in developing countries in the Earth's low latitude belt
- Increased demand for food, water and other resources, particularly in the Middle East and North Africa
- Increased frequency and severity of disease outbreaks
- Increased stress at US borders due to severe effects of climate change in parts of Central America


